This will be a youth-led process where each group will identify goals for themselves as individuals and for their communities and then work with Volunteer Nelson and Youth and Community Works to put together a training schedule focussing on leadership, volunteering and mentoring that will allow them to fulfil these goals. In conjunction with MYTAG a training programme has been developed that will build the capacity of the members through provision of generic and specific training that develops their personal development and team-building and potential career pathways.
