Who participated in the survey?

 80% were school students and 18% were tertiary students

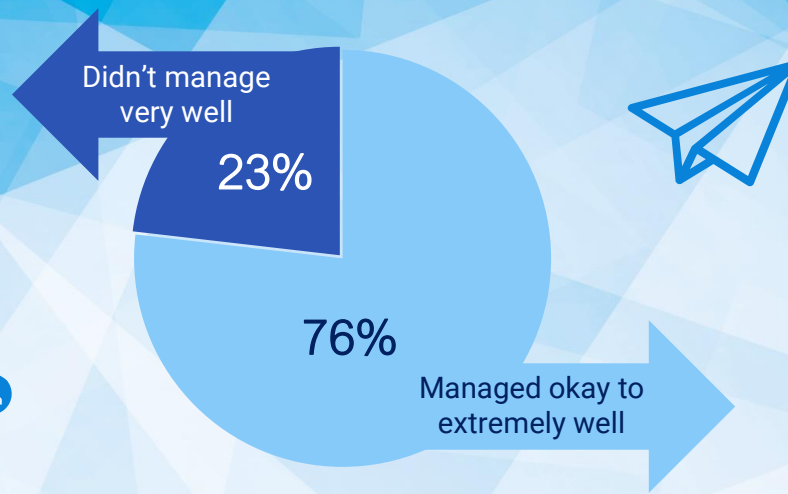
 67% identified as female and 23% identified as male

 60% identified as Pākehā, 17% as Māori, and less than 10% each identified as Pacific, Asian, Middle Eastern, Latin American, African, Indian

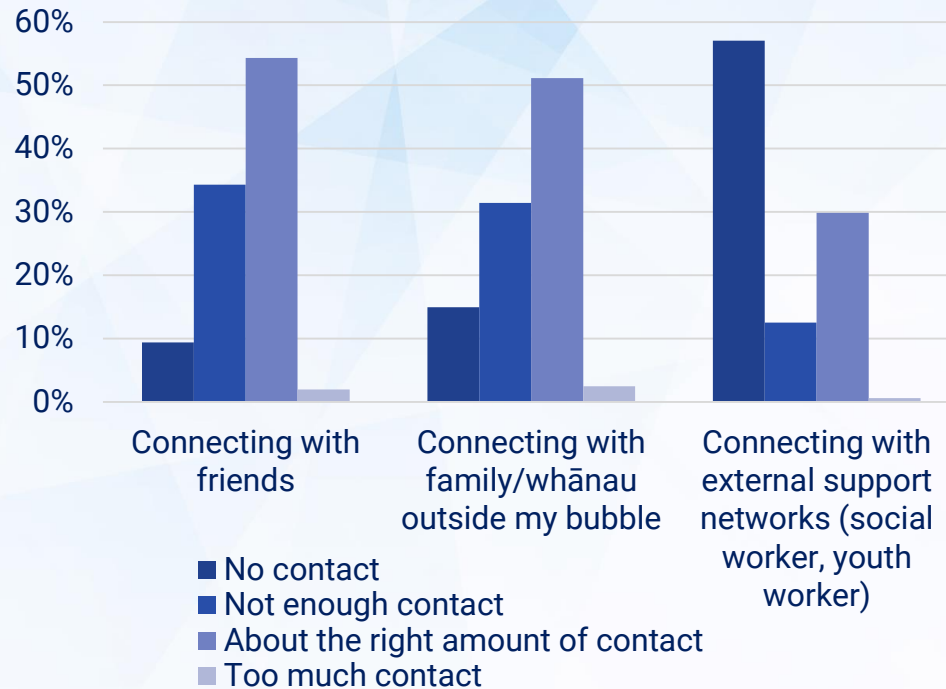
 13% said they were LGBTQI+

 5% said they had a disability

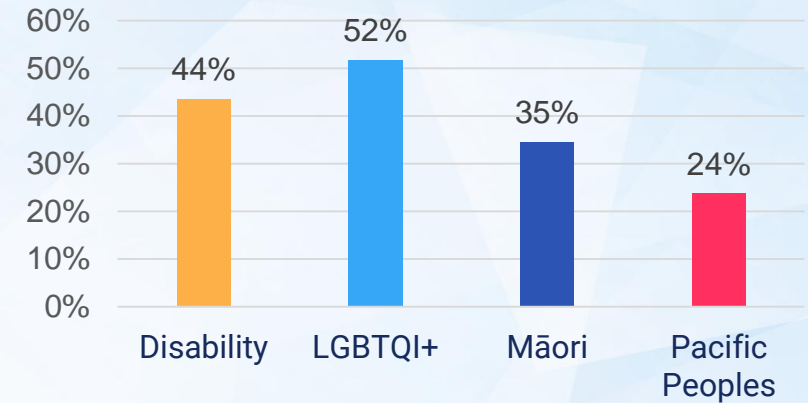

The survey was conducted online and data has not been weighted against the Aotearoa New Zealand population, so results will be biased to those over-represented. These results cannot be generalised to the total population aged 12-24 years.

Education and Work

77% of respondents agreed that they would find returning to their education or training course at least a little helpful moving out of lockdown

59% of 19 to 24 year old respondents agreed that they would find returning to work at least a little helpful moving out of lockdown

49% agreed that access to organised social/cultural events would be at least a little helpful moving out of lockdown
